Ymhen amser fe ddaeth y stad o law i law drwy'r teulu i feddiant mab ac etifedd John Williams Ellis a Harriet Ellen ei wraig, sef John Clough Williams-Ellis, mathemategydd, ysgolhaig a bardd a arddelai'r enw barddol Siôn Pentyrch. Priododd ag Ellen Mabel, merch John Greaves, Plas Waenydd a bu iddynt chwech o feibion. Wedi ei farw ym 1913 daeth Plas Brondanw i feddiant ei ail fab, Betram Clough Williams-Ellis, sef fy nhaid innau.

In time the estate passed down through the family and came into the possession of the son and heir of John Williams Ellis and his wife, Harriet Ellen, who was the mathematician, scholar and poet John Clough Williams-Ellis, who adopted the bardic name Siôn Pentyrch. He married Ellen Mabel, the daughter of John Greaves, Plas Waenydd, and they had six sons. When he died in 1913, the house passed to his second son, Betram Clough Williams-Ellis, who was my grandfather.
